July 29 - 30 | Arusha



Area Overview

Arusha is located at the foothills of Mount Meru on the eastern side of the Great Rift Valley. This is the gateway to the northern safari circuit, with easy access to the Serengeti, Ngorongoro, Lake Manyara, Tarangire, Mount Kilimanjaro, and Mount Meru. Its elevation of 1,400 m (4,600 ft) keeps temperatures relatively cool despite proximity to the equator; temperatures generally range between 10 and 30 C (50 and 86F), with little humidity due to the altitude.

Arusha is serviced by two airports, Kilimanjaro International Airport (JRO) on the eastern side, and Arusha Airport, which primarily services domestic travel. The two airports are connected by the main road, which is notorious for traffic. There is some good shopping available, including the impressive Cultural Heritage, with curio shops, a jewellery boutique, a Tanzanite and precious stone counter, a bargain center, and an art gallery.

Property Overview

Arusha Serena Hotel, Resort & Spa is set among the woodland slopes of Mount Meru at the edge of Lake Duluti. Originally a colonial era coffee farm, today the hotel offers 42 cottage-style guest rooms.

The ambience here is warmly reminiscent of the property's history, beginning with the welcoming stone-built reception area and extending to cottage-style rooms neatly arranged among landscaped lawns and the colorful banks of bougainvillea. Elegant, country-manor interiors feature unique artifacts, leaded windows and French doors opening to extensive lake view gardens. Social areas include a library, a lounge, and a restaurant with a wood fireplace and lake and garden views.

Hike to the summit of Mount Meru, Africa's fifth highest mountain or explore the crater lakes of Arusha National Park. July 30 - August 1 | Tarangire National Park



Area Overview

Tarangire National Park covers an undulating area of 2,850 km2 (1,100 mi2) and is an easy few hours drive from Arusha. Famous for its giant baobabs, savannahs with scattered termite mounds, and large elephant herds, this underrated park is dominated by the perennial Tarangire River.

In the middle of the park, the Silale swamp becomes the main source of water and attracts elephants and predators as the season gets drier and drier. There is a healthy lion population and the other predators are often spotted trailing the plains game as they head to water, or occasionally the cats can be spotted lounging in sausage trees.

Built to blend in with the vastness of its surroundings, Tarangire Sopa Lodge lies hidden among the kopjes, ancient baobab and grasses of the Tarangire National Park - home to the greatest concentration of elephants in Africa.

August 1 - 3 | Ngorongoro Crater



Area Overview

A veritable Garden of Eden, the Ngorongoro Crater is only 260 km² (100mi²) in size yet has some of the highest densities of lion and spotted hyena found anywhere in the world. The view from the crater rim at 2,000 feet above the floor is nothing short of breathtaking. The thick mountain forests of the crater highlands strike a sharp contrast with the short grass plains of the crater floor with its yellow fever Acacia woodlands and streams. The soda lake Magadi in the center of the crater floor sometimes attracts lesser flamingos, and the area is known for very large tusked elephants, black rhino, and great predator action.

Easily accessible from Arusha, the three million year old Ngorongoro Crater was once a gigantic volcano that some suggest was even higher than Mt Kilimanjaro. It is the largest intact caldera in the world and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Walks are available on the rim in certain areas, but game viewing on the crater floor is strictly by vehicle and on designated game drive routes. Local Maasai pastoralists and their villages surround the western side of the crater whilst the eastern side is heavily forested up to the farming town of Karatu.



August 1 - 3 | Ngorongoro Conservation Area



Area Overview

The Ngorongoro Conservation Area (NCA) extends from the crater highlands all the way past Olduvai Gorge and onto the short grasslands of the southern Serengeti and Lake Ndutu. But the wildlife does not adhere to these boundaries and there is very good wildlife viewing, especially during peak calving season when the NCA plains play host to the Great Wildebeest Migration and the birth of hundreds of thousands of wildebeest in a short span of time. This brings predator action, especially with large hyena clans, cheetah, and the return of African hunting dogs.

The NCA is a protected area and a World Heritage Site located 180 km (111 miles) west of Arusha. The area is named after the Ngorongoro Crater, a large volcanic caldera whose name derives from the sound made by the cattle bells of the local Maasai pastoralists.



August 1 - 3 | Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge



Property Overview

Nestled high above the plains into the Crater's jagged rim, cloaked in river stone and indigenous vines, Ngorongoro Serena Safari Lodge is barely visible to the naked eye. Framed by arched stone passages and timbered decks, its torch-lit walls are adorned with stylized cave paintings. At the stone heart of the lodge burns a glowing fire, which is kept constantly alight. Rooms are looped around the Crater rim. Each has its own rock-enclosed balcony, and all enjoy completely uninterrupted views of the volcanic amphitheatre below.

Tanzania's prehistoric Ngorongoro Crater, a UNESCO World Heritage Site known as the Eighth Wonder of the World, has yawned heavenward for millennia. Deep within its immense walls is a breath-taking blue-green landscape dotted with plains, lakes, and forests, an eerie, otherworldly "land that time forgot" thick with massive bull elephants, rhinos, wildebeests, and the highest concentration of lions in Africa.

August 3 - 5 | Serengeti National Park



Area Overview

The Serengeti is perhaps the most famous African wilderness area, its name synonymous with the notion of safari for nearly a hundred years. This UNESCO World Heritage site covers 14,750 km² (5,700 mi²) of premiere game viewing in Acacia woodlands, open grasslands, and undulating savannahs interspersed with seasonal rivers. The park on the northern side borders the Maasai Mara National Reserve in Kenya and, together with several other smaller reserves and conservation areas, forms the larger Mara-Serengeti ecosystem.

Stretching all the way to Lake Victoria, the Western Corridor is characterized by the quintessential safari landscape — open plains dotted with the occasional tree, although there are also beautiful riverine woodlands and some thicker bush areas. There is a good population of cats and general game all year round.

The Great Wildebeest Migration

In May and June this area hosts the Great Wildebeest Migration in their never ending search for water and nutrient dense grasses. If you are lucky you may witness a river crossing, when masses of wildebeest and zebra cross the nearby Grumeti River which, whilst not as large as the Mara River, plays host to the dramatic spectacle of wildebeest trying to cross the crocodile infested waters. The other predators are all present as well, and days here can be very action packed.

Note: The Great Wildebeest Migration and other wildlife phenomena and sightings are natural events and therefore can never be guaranteed.



August 3 - 5 | Mbuzi Mawe Serena Camp



Property Overview

Mbuzi Mawe Serena Camp offers the quintessential Serengeti safari experience. The elegant tented camp is located on one of the main annual migration corridors for over one million wildebeest, half a million zebras and gazelles and their accompanying cast of predators, with close proximity to lions, giraffes, hippos and all of the other fascinating wildlife that inhabit Serengeti National Park.

August 5 - 7 | Hot Air Balloon

Activity overview

A balloon flight over the Maasai Mara is widely considered a bucketlist activity that offers a serene and spectacular experience floating over the vast, lush, and game filled plains.

A lift off at dawn means you watch the sun rise as you head in a generally western direction. Flights usually last close to an hour and depending on the take off spot you float over riverine woodlands, watching hippos return to their daytime refuges and crocodiles basking on sandbanks. Sometimes predators and large antelope herds can be spotted below, pointed out by your experienced captain.

After the flight you will be met by the trailing transfer vehicles and taken to a pre-prepared picnic breakfast, beautifully set up in an idyllic spot on the plains.



August 5 - 7 | Maasai Mara



Area Overview

The Mara (as it is affectionately known) covers 1510 km2 (583 mi2) and is widely considered to be Africa's greatest reserve. The backdrop of the Siria escarpment in the west overlooks sweeping savannas, riverine woodlands, and forests on a deceptively flat landscape that extends eastwards towards the Sekenani Hills and northwards towards the Aitong Hills. The Mara is in essence the northern extension of the Mara-Serengeti ecosystem and plays host to one of nature's greatest phenomenons, the Great Wildebeest Migration.

Because of the quality of wildlife viewing, the Mara has for generations been the setting for hundreds of wildlife documentaries, including Disney's *African Cats*, and the BBC's *Big Cat Diaries* and *Planet Earth*. It is a wildlife photographer's paradise and every year visitors come to capture the spectacular wildlife. The reserve and its conservancies contain some of the highest densities of predators in Africa and this only increases as nomads and vagrants follow the huge herds back and forth through this ecosystem during the seasonal wildebeest migration.



August 5 - 7 | Masai Mara Sopa Lodge



Property Overview

Located high on the slopes of the Oloolaimutia Hills, Masai Mara Sopa Lodge was one of the first safari lodges to be built in the Maasai Mara Game Reserve, a reason why its gardens and trees are so lush and mature. All the buildings follow the design of traditional African round houses with conical roofs, and these stretch along the line of the hills with the impressively large public area buildings and the swimming pool at their center.

There are 99 rooms and suites in total spread across 50 cottages, including options for families or groups.

The Jumbo Bar, with its warm ambiance and decorative cowrie shells, is ideal for pre- and post-dinner gatherings. The Swimming Pool Bar, shaded by a garden canopy, serves refreshing drinks with entertainment from a lively barman. The Ol Murrani Bar features a cozy interior, sports TV, and a pool table, along with an outdoor deck for wildlife viewing. The circular dining room presents lavish buffet spreads, while guests can also enjoy traditional African cuisine on the outdoor timber deck.

August 5 - 7 | Masai Mara Sopa Lodge

Maasai Mara boasts rolling hills, dense forests, and a flat-topped escarpment. Spanning 1,510 km2, it shares a border with Tanzania's Serengeti National Park and is owned and managed by the Maasai people. Renowned for its rich biodiversity, the reserve is home to over 410 bird species and 60 raptor species, offering unparalleled game viewing experiences. One of its highlights is the annual migration of millions of wildebeest, zebras, and gazelles from the Serengeti to the Mara River. Watching these animals brave crocodile-infested waters during their migration is a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

The lodge has 50 guest cottages divided into two wings to either side of the main public areas. Each of these cottages house two spacious guest rooms with queen and king-size beds, mosquito nets, electronic safes, dressing tables, en-suite bathrooms, and sheltered verandas that all have views over the gardens and the game reserve beyond. Six of the cottages each contain two suites with larger bedrooms and bathrooms, and both indoor and outdoor seating areas.

August 7 - 8 | Lake Nakuru National Park



Area Overview

Lake Nakuru is a 188 km² (72 mi²) national park, near the town of Nakuru, and a few hours drive north of Nairobi. At 1,750 m (5,755 ft), Nakuru National Park is home to one of the highest soda lakes in the Great Rift Valley, and is famous for the hundreds of thousands of flamingos that come to feed in its rich algal waters.

The presence of the flamingos is dictated by the water levels and blue-green algae levels and sometimes the birds will migrate to other soda lakes if these are affected by drought, pollution, or floods. However, the park has other very good wildlife, especially leopard and rhino. Rothschild's giraffes were translocated here and are doing very well, as the habitat of open grasslands and Acacia woodlands is ideal for them. The only member of the Big 5 not present is elephant, otherwise it is a highly underrated national park.



August 7 - 8 | Lake Nakuru Sopa Lodge



Property Overview

Located on a range of hills that form the western limits of Africa's Great Rift Valley, the lodge offers spectacular views over the vastness of Africa. The lodge also overlooks Lake Nakuru and its surrounding National Park, one that is a paradise for bird watchers and wildlife lovers alike. A multitude of animals and birds can be found in Lake Nakuru National Park, including white and black rhinos and the rare Rothschild's giraffes. Lake Nakuru National Park is mainly a wooded and bushy grassland with a wide ecological diversity and characteristic habitats that range from the lake waters to the escarpment and ridges.

There are 60 rooms in total, including interleading options. The lounge, bar, and dining room have extensive sheltered outdoor terraces. The infinity swimming pool overlooks the lake and has a pool bar. Board games are available and there is a gift shop and wifi.

Experience & Activities

The park lies in Central Kenya, 140 km north-west of Nairobi, in Nakuru district of the Rift Valley Province. The ecosystem comprises of the lake, surrounded by mainly wooded and bushy grasslands. The park supports a wide ecological diversity with flamingos (greater and lesser) and other water birds being the major attractions of the area. The ecosystem provides for about 56 different species of mammals including the white rhino and buffaloes and a variety of terrestrial birds numbering nearly 450 species. Activities include game drives, bush dining, bird watching, and nature walks.

August 8 - 10 | Samburu Game Reserve



Area Overview

Samburu is a 165 km2 (63 mi2) national reserve situated 350 km (217 mi) north of Nairobi at an altitude of 800 to 1,230m (2,625 - 4,000 ft). At the heart of the reserve, flowing through doum palm groves and thick riverine forest, is the picturesque Ewaso Nyiro River, without whose waters the game could not survive in this arid region. Samburu is home to one of Kenya's largest elephant populations and several well known research projects on carnivores, lions, and elephants. Four of the Big Five can be found and, though no rhino are present, it is considered an excellent place to look for leopard, lion, and elephant.

The game reserve sits in the shadow of the sacred mountain Ol Doinyo Sabachae and is home to the Nilotic Samburu people. The Samburu are known for their nomadic pastoralist lifestyle, much like their relatives the Maasai, as well as their glamorous beadwork and colourful shukas.



August 8 - 10 | Samburu Sopa Lodge



Property Overview

Located inside the Samburu National Reserve in Northern Kenya, Samburu Sopa Lodge enjoys panoramic views of the vastness of Samburu shrub land and the hills beyond. There are 60 rooms in total, including options for families.

August 10 - 11 | Nairobi



Area Overview

Nairobi is the capital of Kenya and East Africa's most cosmopolitan city, with a vibrant population of 4.5 million. Unique to the city is the proximity of Nairobi National Park, a true wilderness area juxtaposed against the larger urban metropolis. It is the only national park like it in the world and a real embodiment of the human-wildlife conflicts that challenge many African communities who must learn to cohabitate with wildlife on their doorstep.

Nairobi National Park is one of the best places in Africa to see rhino and also has a healthy population of lion, leopard, cheetah, and plains game like giraffe and antelope. Other attractions include the Karen Blixen Museum, the Giraffe Center, Daphne Sheldrick's Elephant Orphanage, a visit to a tea farm, and shopping for local crafts and trinkets. There are some great local and cross-cultural restaurants to explore, from roadside food stalls to local *nyama choma* (barbecue joints) to five-star dining establishments.



August 10 - 11 | Carnivore Nairobi



Area Overview

Carnivore is an open-air restaurant in the Langata suburb of Nairobi, Kenya. Carnivore's specialty is meat, and features an all-you-can-eat meat buffet. They serve a wide variety of meat and were famous for their game meat until Kenya imposed a ban on the sale of game meat in 2004. It remains a popular tourist destination.

The game, including giraffe, wildebeest, ostrich and crocodile, was raised on Hopcraft Ranch, 40 kilometres (25 mi) outside Nairobi. Since the sale of wild game meat was banned in Kenya in 2004, the restaurant serves meat of domestic animals such as beef, pork, lamb, and chicken, as well as farmed ostrich and crocodile meat. The meat is skewered on Maasai swords, cooked on coals, and served on cast-iron plates. It does have a vegetarian option. It ranked 47th on Restaurant magazine's "World's Best 50 Restaurants" list in 2003.



August 10 - 11 | Crowne Plaza Nairobi Airport



Property Overview

Welcome to Crowne Plaza Nairobi Airport, conveniently located a five-minute drive from Jomo Kenyatta International Airport with complimentary airport transfers on the hour.

Area Overview

The town of Victoria Falls lies on the southern banks of the Zambezi River at the western edge of the falls that it is named after. After David Livingstone set his eyes on the "smoke that thunders" in 1855, the settlement was later developed in 1901 when the possibility of using the waterfall for hydro-electric power was explored, and expanded when the railway from Bulawayo reached the town shortly before the Victoria Falls Bridge was opened in April 1905, connecting Southern Rhodesia (later Rhodesia; now Zimbabwe) to Northern Rhodesia (later Zambia).

Vic Falls, as it is affectionately abbreviated to, is known as the adventure capital of Africa, with any number of outdoor and adventure activities to choose from. As well as world-class white water rafting, there is one of the world's highest bungee jumps, skydiving, swing slides, helicopter rides and more.
